PURPOSE OF ROLE

KEY TASKS

- From April to September, you are required to attend weekly afterschool training, with games on weeknights or Saturday mornings (depending on the team coached).
 - The time commitment for each team coached will amount to approximately 4-6 hours per week. Travelling time will be paid.
 - Focus will be on teaching the girls excellent technique and knowledge of the game.
 - Ensure girls are game fit and focused.
 - Ensure Nga Tawa is competitive in all competitions played.
